



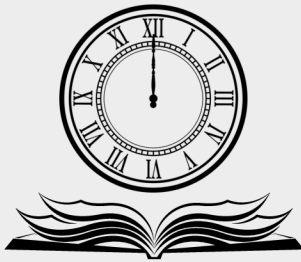

Melinda Hackett is a Southampton-based painter and printmaker.

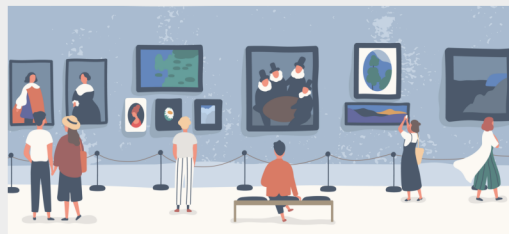

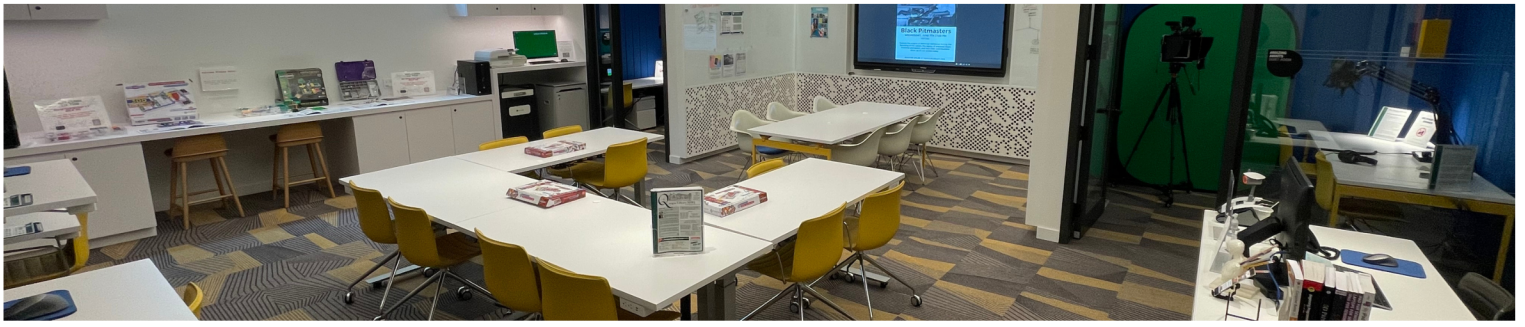

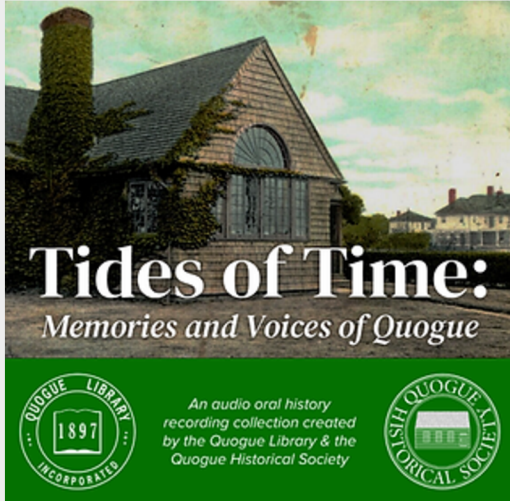

LIFELONG LEARNING - THE INNOVATION LAB



The Quogue Library and Quogue Historical Society are proud to announce a collaborative oral history recording program, with cooperation from New York Heritage Digital Collections and Long Island Library Resource Council (LILRC).

In 2023, the Quogue Library and Quogue Historical Society came together to create an oral history project to preserve the history of the Village of Quogue as told by some of its current residents from their own firsthand lived experiences. "Tides of Time: Memories and Voices of Quogue" documents their personal narratives and captures memories of life in the village through recorded interviews. The recordings, along with text transcripts, will add to and enhance the QHS and Library collections, serving as an invaluable primary source of information and wisdom for future generations of residents and researchers on the rich history of our unique community.

This new audio project will be the first of its kind in Quogue and will make use of the advanced recording technology available at the Quogue Library's Innovation Lab. Residents will be interviewed and recorded at the Library by members of the Quogue Historical Society board and Library technology staff.

Once the interviews are completed, the audio recordings and text transcripts will be uploaded to the New York Heritage Digital Collections repository for long-term preservation. Library staff received certification training from LILRC on how to format and upload the files to the repository. There, the collection of oral histories will be available to the public for posterity, to serve as a permanent document of Quogue's legacy. The recordings will also be accessible on the Library's website and copies will be available in the Library.

Participation in the oral history recording program is currently limited to invite-only interviews of Quogue residents from a list curated by the Quogue Historical Society and Quogue Library. As the program develops, a waiting list will be shared on the Library's and Historical Society's websites for interested Quogue residents to sign up to be notified when the program is open for additional interviews. **Visit QuogueLibrary.org for more information.**
